## Introduction

Purple Fest: Celebrating Diversity

Date: 6 - 8 January, 2023

Venue: Entertainment Society of Goa

Disabilities do not equate to inabilities and so the **Purple Fest** 2023 was organized to celebrate diversity and inclusion of persons with disabilities (PwDs). The **Purple Fest 2023**, India's first-of-its-kind inclusive fest a distinctive 3-day event was held from 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> January 2023 at the Entertainment Society of Goa, Panaji that aimed to show how people can come together to create a welcoming and inclusive world for everyone. **Purple Fest** was organised by the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Govt of Goa in association with Directorate of Social Welfare-Goa, Entertainment Society of Goa and Department of Tourism.

The event intended to encourage people to overcoming personal stereotypes as well as to establish an environment that not only educates everyone about the disabled community and their capabilities but also respect and celebrate diversity. The festival which promoted inclusion and engagement of all people on a shared platform attracted over 5,000+ delegate registrations, including members of the disabled community and other individuals from all over the country. The event had 1000 local volunteers to assist the delegates, persons with and without disability for all three days. More than 50,000 people visited various venues and were mesmerized by the scale of the event.

Every activity planned for Purple Fest had a purpose. The Purple Think Tank sessions were meant to create dialogue among various stakeholders so as to empower persons with disability. The Sports events celebrated the spirit of competition and also conveyed the need to organise such Para games and activities thereby creating more opportunities for persons with disability.

Jagruti Mela provided an opportunity to parents, NGOs and other stakeholders to clarify their queries by interacting with the service providers. In Purple Dialogue, the speakers discussed eight different threads of conversations that are set up with experts and the Purple Ambassadors. The inputs given by the experts will be used to develop essential policies and policy modifications. This will aid advocacy not only in Goa but also at the national and state levels.

The delegates were then transferred to a specially modified wheelchair with inflatable wheels.

## Saksham Car Rally For Visually Impaired

Blind Car Rally held in Panjim as part of Purple Fest-  
First ever accessible Blind Car Rally held in Goa

Purple Fest 2023, Celebrating Diversity: held its first-ever accessible car rally, featuring visually impaired individuals as navigators and braille maps as their guides, making it a historic event.

On Saturday individuals served as drivers in this innovative exercise that displayed the true meaning of interdependence.

The Blind Car Rally was flagged off by the Minister of Social Welfare, Subhash Phal Dessai and State Commissioner of Persons with Disabilities, Guruprasad Pawaskar. Television actress, Pooja Bedi was the special guest.

State Commissioner of Persons with Disabilities, Guruprasad Pawaskar, was overwhelmed with emotion as he spoke. "I thank The Rotary Club of Panjim and all the Rotarians who have come here to be part of this unique- Blind Car Rally. I'm sure you'll carry great memories from this Purple Fest. It is a dream come true, as I wanted to organise something like this for years now."

Pooja Bedi, Television Actress stated, "I think it's really wonderful when people come together to empower, help and support each other and encourage people to do better and shine bright."

Sujith Kumar, Director of Pro Sports, the organizer of rally, said "The response from participants is very positive and they loved the rally."

35 cars with 35 drivers participated, along with 40 navigators who came from various parts of the country.



## Purple Experience Zone

### Inclusive Carnival

Inclusive Carnival is a pioneering activity developed by Akshadhaa Foundation. The foundation has been training and educating individuals with neuro-development challenges for over a decade now. With these events, we seek to encourage government officials, regulatory bodies, and common people to contribute to the culture of inclusion of children with disabilities. The Carnival was a fun and experiential pathway to understand and engage with the neuro-diverse brain which is still a grey area for science. The next logical step of Akshadhaa is launching an Assisted Living facility for neuro diverse persons and their families.





## Antarchakshu

Antarchakshu is a simulation workshop designed to provide a sneak peek into the world of a person with disability. Participants experienced simulated activities for a few minutes and were made to perform a few simple tasks in a safe environment. Immersive activities were designed to mirror the experience of navigating life with disability.





## Museum Of Possibilities

Museum of Possibilities holds infinite possibilities. This space encouraged interaction with the community of users, creators and innovators and persons with disability.

This zone catered to many aspects of a life of a person with disability- from education, employment and healthcare to transportation, housing and others.

With the theme 'Live', 'Work' and 'Play', the exhibits are not categorized as per a specific disability but showcased solutions to overcome barriers faced on a daily basis. The Museum of Possibilities demonstrated an accessible home model with adapted products and assistive aids and technology for everyday use and access. This will be an experience zone for everyone to understand accessibility and universally designed products to foster independent living.

Jagruti Mela is the unavailable opportunity for many Persons with Disabilities and their community. Person with Disabilities will able to see their future and making plan to reach right service providers towards sustainable livelihood.





## Purple We Care Film Festival

We Care Film Festival focussed on the accessibility for persons with disability. We have not seen anything like this ever before, in Goa or in all of India.

Kapoor has conceptualised and produced the National Anthem featuring Amitabh Bachchan and children with different disabilities. 25 films will be screened over the course of the Purple Fest for over 5,000 people. "This will be our 199<sup>th</sup> venue for We Care Film Festival and I'm excited," Kapoor adds.

Some of the films that were screened are 'The Wizard of Needles', 'National Anthem in sign', 'Virtue', 'Means to Live', 'I am special, So are you', 'Tiny steps', etc. The films will be at Inox, Panjim.

As much as Purple Fest celebrates diversity, it seems to have brought about awareness among the general Goan population who wish to come and experience the Purple Zone and learn more about disability and inclusion.

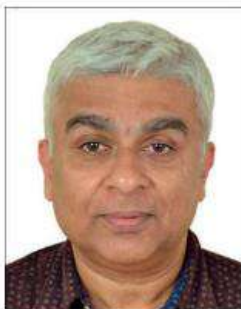

## 10<sup>th</sup> Mister And Miss Deaf India





The Purple Fest played host to the 10<sup>th</sup> annual Miss and Mister Deaf India 2023 beauty pageant, organised by the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, the All-India Deaf Arts and Cultural Society (AIDACS), and the Goa Association of the Deaf.

The event which was held at the Gera School (TGS) Auditorium, Old Goa, provides the deaf youth community of India with a national platform to showcase their talent and venture into the mainstream fashion industry. It also opens the doors for them to pursue any other dreams in such a field. The winners eventually participate in the Miss and Mister Deaf International, Europe, and Asia pageants. The Ms. Deaf India 2023 winner was Varsha G. Sheetal was the first runner up and Sadiya Bandodkar was the second runner-up.



## Purple I-Run Goa Marathon

Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Goa & I-Help Foundation Goa (a non-profit organisation) organised Purple I-Run Goa Marathon on the third day of Purple Fest which is Goa's First National Marathon for 21 types of disabilities. It is a half marathon event which was held at Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Stadium, Bambolim. This marathon aimed to promote inclusiveness and acceptability of people with disabilities in our society. People with disabilities ran together with other runners in all age categories. All the participants of special categories were facilitated at the event.

Sangeeta Vishnoi from Jodhpur, Rajasthan participated in the Purple I-Run with full enthusiasm and positive vibes. She ran 2 km with other participants in the Marathon. Despite being disabled with Cheeta Foot also called as Blade runner, her enthusiasm of participation at the purple fest and other different levels did not hold her back.





## All India Open Para TT Championship Goa 2023

All India Para Table Tennis Open Championship All India Para Table Tennis Open Championship Goa 2023 was organised by the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities in association with Directorate of Social Welfare and Sports Authority of Goa. 140 participants from 15 different states were part of the tournament with 82 standing players and 58 players on wheelchairs.

The event concluded with winners taking home 13 Gold, 13 Silver and 20 Bronze medals in different classifications.



## Unified Beach Cricket

“During Purple Fest, Special Olympics will be conducting sports events here. Unified Beach Cricket will be played at Miramar Beach on 3<sup>rd</sup> January. There will be demonstration of the Baggo and Bocce game on 6<sup>th</sup> January at Inox. It's a great feeling to have the Unified Beach Cricket, being introduced for the first time in India here at Purple Fest,” says Victor R. Vaz, National Sports Director and Special Olympics Bharat.

For the game a team consists of 4 special athletes and 2 partners (six playing members in a team). The playing area is 50mtrs × 50mtrs. Matches here will be played at 6 overs per side, where each player will bowl one over and each batsman will face six deliveries. Only one batsman will bat at a time. A typical game will be played for 30 minutes each with a 2-minute break in between innings.





## Inter State Blind Cricket Match

The Inter-State Blind Cricket Tournament was held as part of the Purple Fest. The tournament witnessed a total of six teams participating including Goa, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Pondicherry and Telangana. The 20 overs match with the basic rules of Cricket was played by four completely blind players, three who can see up to a distance of 2 mts and four with 6 mts vision. The final of the same was held at the GCA ground Porvorim here on Sunday in between Goa and Telangana. Telengana won the match by 152 runs, with the highest highest team total of 312 runs scored in the Finals. Goa emerged Runners- Up in the tournament.

## Access India Convention



Panjim, January 5, 2023

As a part of Purple Fest which is set to begin on January 6, Access India Convention was organized by the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities and the Directorate of Social Welfare, Goa in association with Access India. This was held on Thursday at Clube Tennis De Gasper Dias, Miramar, Panjim.

The event was inaugurated by the Minister for Social Welfare, Subhash Phal Dessai and State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Guruprasad Pawaskar. The event was well-endowed by the Minister of Power, Sudin Dhavalikar. Also present for the convention was Solicitor and Core team member of the Access India Convention Kanchan Pamnani and Secretary of State Commission for Persons with Disabilities in Goa, Taha Haaziq.

Speaking about how digitalization has empowered persons with disabilities, Minister of Social Welfare, Subhash Phal Dessai said, “The revolution created by mobile phones has been phenomenal. Persons with disabilities have been keeping up with this revolution by using mobiles to overcome challenges and using various software like dictations, voicemail, banking. This helps gain knowledge on how to stay connected with the world. Digitisation has provided access to all of that to all of us.”

Multiple initiatives have been started through the Purple Fest for social and economic empowerment of people with disabilities. The focus has also been on providing quality education, providing placement, and making sure that discrimination and crimes against persons with disabilities are strictly penalized.

“Persons with disabilities have immaculate potential, creativity, ability, skills, and talent. A PwD does not lack ability just because one organ is not functional and that does not term them lesser than anyone. The fire and strength of each person reflect our motives,” he added.

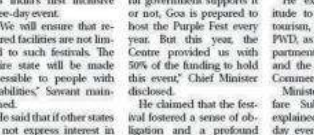
